1993 Banquet to be Held in June

The 1993 alumni Reunion Banquet will be held Saturday, June 26 at the Hoover Price Campus Center of Mount Union College. A reception begins at 6:15 pm with a buffet dinner at 7:00 pm. Scholarships and Outstanding Alumni Awards will be presented. Special recognition is planned for members of the classes of 1943 and 1968! Don't miss this fun evening. Banquet to Honor Class of 1943 and 1968

The honor classes for the Marlinton Alumni Association this year share more than an alma mater-both lived with their nation at war. For members of the Class of 1943 at Marlboro High School, it was a global war involving the majority of the planet; for the Class of 1968 it was the highest year of our involvement in the Vietnam War.

1943 - Their role in supporting a nation at war ranged from canvassing the county for all kinds of metal junk, participating in a "Stamp and Bond Day" that resulted in the best per capita giving in the county (\$18 per student), getting out of school early to help work crops and still maintaining an almost normal regimen of school activities - ranging from baseball and basketball for the boys (the lack of tires and gas resulted in cancellation of the football program), boys and girls glee clubs, band, school newspaper and yearbook and clubs such as Home Economics, French and Hi-Y.

"Peck's Bad Boy" was the senior play, a comedy held in conjunction with Class Night because of gasoline rationing.

Class officers who lead the seniors through their final year at Marlboro were Richard Kuhn, President; Bill Gressinger, Vice-president; Miriam Gilcrest, Secretary, and Lois Whitacre, Treasurer.

Before that senior year became history, the class attended prom at Morgan's Mansion in Alliance, attended a baccalaureate service and on May 27 donned caps and gowns for graduation.

1968 - By 1968, the Marlboro Township educational facility had become a consolidation of three townships and the senior class numbered 229. Officers were Clyde Lepage, president; Tom Robinson, vice-president; Marjorie Lutton, secretary and Greg Miller, treasurer.

With a half million Americans fighting in Vietnam, the seniors wondered about their future and worried about draft notices. Meanwhile, life went on. Who could forget the night we won the Federal League basketball championship, the Latin Club's Roman toga parties, stool races in chemistry and physics class, or "Congo" Kirk at the Senior Assembly.

Perhaps the spirit of the class was caught in the class motto: "We are here to do what we can for, not to get what we can from." This is an excerpt from the school yearbook: "A high school student's life is a merger of many different activities, including classes, athletic events, exams, dances and club meetings."
