District Family Honors Marlboro "First Lady & Gentleman"

Mary Elizabeth & Harold Devies Memorial Scholarship Established

Harold (Bud) Devies and Mary Elizabeth (Betty) Devies both graduated from Marlboro High School in 1939. Bud lived to be 93 years old and Betty lived to be 96. Betty was Salutatorian of her class and Harold was their class president.

Betty graduated from the Aultman School of Nursing in 1943 and worked as a registered Nurse with Alliance

City Hospital. Bud was a staff sergeant with the United States Army Air Corps and served in Panama during WWII. Betty served as a charge nurse with the Army Nurse Corp during World War II in both the United States and the European Theater. While serving in the military Betty loved to dance. She and Bud were married May 31, 1946 until his death in 2015. When her three children wondered why they had never seen their parents dance, Betty said "We did. We did the night-time rock the babies dance."

Betty worked at Alliance City Hospital after the war, but when she had children she was determined to be a stay-at-home mom, later working only weekends. Her children, daughters Aleda and Bonnie and son Leslee, remember getting up on Saturday and watch cartoons with their dad, until time for Mom to come home. Then the kids would scramble to get dressed, clean up the house and do dishes before she got home. Bud usually managed to work up a sweat and look like he'd been working all day. Church was an important part of Bud and Betty's life, and their Sunday school class was very special to them. They

raised their families together, celebrated successes and mourned losses together for a lifetime.

Betty was a faithful friend and a nurse to all. People in the community would often stop by her home and she would help and administer their medications. She was an amateur historian and prolific writer. With her manual typewriter she authored two books,

Marlboro My Home Town and A Nurse's Letters Home. When living at Canton Christian Home she belonged to their

writing group. Bud was a member of the Marlboro Volunteers and an avid bowler. He was a plant supervisor with Columbia Gas, retiring in 1983 after 43 years of service.

Bud and Betty were members of Marlboro Christian Church. Betty served as a Women's Guild member of the Aultman Alumni 50 Year Club, AARP Chapter 3932, Jane Bain Chapter of the DAR, Marlboro Township Historical

Society, Marlington Senior Citizens, Marlington Alumni Association, and Marlington Memorial Day Association. The couple were honored to ride in the Marlboro Memorial Day Parade with the Marlboro Volunteers for many years. Bud and Betty will be remembered most for caring about their family, church, and community. According to her daughter, "Marlboro was as important to them as we were!"

This scholarship will support students with an interest in nursing or medicine and will forever honor the Devies' commitment to their community.

Jack Hazen ('58) and longtime Malone University cross country coach was recently inducted into the US Track and Field Cross Country Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Hazen, a Malone coach for the past 51 years, was recipient of the MAA Outstanding Alumni Award in 1998. Under Hazen's leadership, the Malone's men's cross-country program qualified for the national meet every year during the

institution's time in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), never losing a conference/district meet from 1968 to 2010 – a 43 year streak unmatched in collegiate sports.

Author of several textbooks on coaching, Hazen has served in numerous international coaching Most recently, he served as assistant coach for the USA Track and Field Team at the 2012 London Olympic Games where he worked with Team USA's distance runners. Other international appointments include Head Manager for the 1999 Junior Pan American Track & Field Team, twice serving as the U.S. Coach for men's cross country at the World Championships in Boston and Capetown, South Africa, and assistant coach for the U.S. World Championship meet in Helsinki, Finland in 2005. Jack has coached two Olympians and served on the Track and Field Competition Management Team at the 1996 Atlanta Olympics.

2018 Outstanding Alumni Honored

The 2018 MAA Outstanding Alumni award recipient is **SMSgt Frederick L. Elsass**, who enlisted in the United States Air Force in January 1962. After

basic training and aircraft maintenance training, he was assigned to Travis Air Force Base in California to maintain the C-124 aircraft. Fred served in Vietnam for a year and then returned to the states, assigned to Lockbourne Air Force Base. now known Rickenbacker. as at Columbus, Ohio.

In January 1972, Fred was assigned to Strategic Air Command Dyess Air Force Base at Abilene, Texas and remained there for seven years. During that time, he was promoted to Master Sergeant. He moved from there to RAF Fairford,

England in July 1979 where he was responsible for developing a training program. His efforts were recognized by an excellent rating by the Strategic Air Command Inspector General. This is where he met his wife, Jill.

In 1980 he returned to Dyess Air Force Base and was promoted to Senior Master Sergeant responsible for the health, welfare, morale and discipline of all the enlisted personnel in the squadron and chief adviser to the squadron commander concerning the enlisted force.

Fred's knowledge and experience in opening the base at RAF Fairford gave him the next opportunity to take part in opening a similar base at RAF Greenham Common which was to house Ground Launched Cruise Missiles (GLCM) with nuclear capability. He arrived in January 1983 and became the First Sergeant of the Security Police Group who was to guard the nuclear missiles. It

was to grow to a unit of 375 enlisted personnel. This brand-new unit was activated in January 1984 and received an outstanding rating from NATO.

Fred was identified as the leader of the best group of First Sergeants in the Command. The Cruise Missile program was the tip of the spear and had a strong hand in causing the Soviet Union to crumble.

Returning home in 1985 Fred was once again assigned **Dyess** to Air Force Base and returned to the duty of Training Superintendent the brand-new for B-1B bomber. He was responsible for the training and qualification more than 900 technicians and about 50 career fields One year later the unit received an

outstanding rating from the Strategic Air Command Inspector General Operational Readiness Team.

After 27 years, one month and 21 days Fred retired on his birthday, March 1, 1989. His decorations include but are not limited to, two Meritorious Service Medals, four Air Force Commendation Medals and nine Air Force Good Conduct Medals.

At the MAA's banquet, Rich Desrosiers, Executive Editor of the Canton Repository, introduced Fred, highlighting his service in the Air Force as well as his community philanthropy. In his remarks to those in attendance, Mr. Elsass said "The Air Force afforded me my greatest opportunities." He listed "three really smart things" he has done in his life which include quitting smoking, joining the Air Force, and marrying Jill. He cited Marlington teacher and founder of the Marlington Alumni Association, Eleanor Ramser, and his father as his role models.



Marlington Honors Veterans

On Friday, November 10, the Marlington Alumni Association (MAA) joined with members of the Class of 1966 to honor fallen classmates at the annual Marlington High School Veterans Day Program.

While planning their 50th reunion two years ago, graduates from the Marlington High School Class of '66 recounted the impact of the Vietnam War on their class. Like other schools in Stark County, their class lost more men in military service than any other classes. In response, they chose to honor those fallen by establishing an MAA scholarship in their memory, and discussed the merits of a permanent recognition plaque to honor all fallen Marlington Alumni.

The group approached fellow classmates, community leaders and businesses and garnered support for the bronze memorial. Before the memorial was unveiled, biographic information about each of the Marlington alums who gave their lives in military service to our country was presented by Tom Swartz ('66), John Thomas ('66), Deborah White, mother of Ashley White, and MAA President, Vondea Sheaffer.

In order of presentation: Francis Vadas, a 1942 graduate of Marlboro High School, was just 21 years old when he was killed in France during WWII; Alvis Faverty, a 1965 Marlington High School graduate, died August 18, 1968 in Vietnam at the age of 21; Denny Wahl, graduated in 1966 and was killed in Vietnam July 21, 1967; Rome Edward (Eddie) Dimmerling, graduated in 1966 and died in Vietnam at the age of 19 on April 20, 1968; William (Bill) Harley Prather graduated in 1966 and died in Vietnam on September 12, 1968; Ronald Garrison died January 21, 1971 in Vietnam; and Ashley White,

a 2005 graduate died October 22, 2011 in Afghanistan at the age of 24. Recognition of Paul Fox ('38) has since been added. Paul served in the US 7th Army and died in 1945 in a German POW camp.

The plaque honoring these alums will hang in the hallway of the high school as a permanent reminder of the greatest sacrifice given.
