### Annual Golf Scramble Scheduled

# Interview with an Inspirational Individual

Not many four-year olds have decided what their life's profession is going to be. That wasn't true of Eleanor Haidet Ramser, who had been dubbed "our school teacher" by her paternal grandfather who had decided by that tender age she would be a teacher. By the time she entered elementary school, there was absolutely no question; her goal was to become a teacher; to love and mold her students into wholesome individuals. It was a goal she would not only achieve, but would excel at for 44 years, all of them at Marlington High School and its predecessor, Marlboro High School.

The Marlboro Township school board probably had no idea what a bargain they were getting when they hired the diminutive (just an inch over five feet tall) Eleanor Haidet fresh from the halls of Mount Union College in 1943. Her college major was Latin and her minor was English, while her initial teaching assignments were history and English.

Of course, she wasn't Miss Haidet for long. Seventh graders met Miss Haidet in 1947, but by the time they entered the eighth grade it was Mrs. Ray Ramser. It is a marriage that is still going strong today, 54 years later. Eleanor took on many responsibilities at the school, including the girls' physical education teacher, public

# Honoring the 50ti Year Class



### Class of 1951 from Marlboro

"What We Are to Be, We Are Now Becoming." was the motto selected by the Marlboro High School Class of 1951, which began their freshman year under the guidance of Miss Mildred Young with 23 members receiving diplomas.

They chose yellow and brown as class colors, with the yellow carnation as class flower. Their senior year was shortened by weather, with the Thanksgiving vacation extending from November 27 to December 4, 1950 with a couple of February snow days tossed in for good measure.

Ron Davis and Joe Werner were chosen president and vice president respectively for their final year at MHS. It was the third time Davis was named to that post. Werner was president for their sophomore year.

Top scholastic honors were attained by Mary Kuhn, valedictorian, and Mary Smith, salutatorian, while Werner was the class pick as most likely to succeed. Kuhn and Werner were also tabbed by the classmates as the most popular students, while Edith Tope was selected Homecoming attendant. Popular waltz tunes dominated the selection of favorite music, led by "The Tennessee Waltz."

As sophomores, the class came up with the idea of selling school supplies at lunch time, a tradition used by many following classes to bolster their class treasury.

"The Boarding House Reach" was selected as the senior class play with 16 members of the class, including all of the girls, having a role and gaining thespian experience. Later in the year, six members of the class, Mary Smith, Mary Kuhn, Edith Tope, Dick Sledden, Joe Werner and Ronald Davis were featured in the all-school play, "Great Caesar's Ghost."

As their senior year rolled to a conclusion, the class took part in baccalaureate on May 20, commencement on May 23 and the grand finale, a trip to New York City.

relations director for the school system, chairman of the Foreign Language department, Spanish club advisor, and organizer of Marlington's first Student Council.

"I believe that a teacher must know her subject well and use every possible method to transfer this knowledge to the student." she says of her philosophy of teaching. "Praise is an important element ... it is necessary to use visual aids, audio practice, written work, and verbal expression to motivate the student. Education is living and learning to improve one's quality of life."

That was soon evident as she provided the leadership needed to make the dream of a Marlington Alumni Association a reality. Her enthusiasm and zeal sparked the fledgling organization from about 100 charter members to a current enrollment of nearly 1,000; with a scholarship program that was launched with two \$100 awards to more than \$10,000 in student assistance a year ago.

The years have seen many changes in students, not all of them good. She has seen an erosion of respect, a lessened willingness to make an effort to learn the dangers of alcohol and drug use and abuse. She weathered those changes, continued her outstanding classroom efforts and earning Marlington High School Teacher of the Year laurels in 1980.

## Outstanding Alumni Honored at Banquet

Recipients of the Distinguished Alumni Awards at the annual alumni banquet were Donald Prather of the Class of 1952 and Neal Franks of the Class of 1954. Prather was praised for his commitment to business, his community and his family. His service as a volunteer fireman was also recognized.

Beginning as a young farm boy, he was employed at the Hoover Company and then as an excavator after graduation. Later he became a partner in the newly formed Custom Poly bag firm in 1969. The firm, of which he is now president, has grown to a \$7 million business with 55 employees.

Prather humbly accepted his award and expressed gratitude to his family and everyone present who made it possible to receive this honor.

Franks, who was recovering from surgery at home in the Raleigh-Durham area is a graduate of Manchester College, with a Ph.D from Ohio State University. He is a principal scientist for Novo Nordisk BioChem of Franklinton, NC. Currently involved in introduction of applied biotechnology into the pulp and paper industry, he attributed his desire to become an industrial chemist to high school chemistry. Franks voiced recognition of the capable and dedicated teachers and administrators while expressing his gratitude to them for helping to send him on his way.
