## MAA Motto Takes on New Meaning

*"Past ... Helping ... Future."* On May 7th all of us; graduates, employees, and residents, can effect the future of Marlington Schools. The Board is faced with a unique opportunity. The State of Ohio has offered to provide 54% ( 31 million dollars) of the funds needed to build three new elementary buildings, a new high school, and to expand and renovate the middle school. In exchange, the State requires that the Marlington voters pass a bond issue to raise the other 46% or 26.7 million dollars. These new and renovated buildings will support the changes mandated by the state, as well as provide smaller class sizes, and expanded opportunities for students to access the technology they will need to succeed in the 21st century.

If the issue fails, it will cost the district more than 30 million dollars to renovate the existing buildings to meet current state school building standards. The renovations would only provide temporary relief and the district would once again be faced with the burdensome costs of aging, out-of-date facilities. **The States building project is the best opportunity to be presented to the Marlington Schools since the formation of the district.**

The bond issue committee needs YOUR HELP to see that this passes. Help can range from registering to vote, sending in absentee ballots and making phone calls, to placing yard signs, and donating money to the campaign. Quiet humility, keen professionalism and acute dedication are hallmarks of Thomas Hazen, retired Marlington High School principal, vocational guidance counselor and teacher.

Abilities, attitude and modesty commanded respect for this man, who is filled with a consummate desire to see good in others and the epitome of dignity, appreciation for friends and family and concern for others.

Former associates had praise to spare of the man who seemed so taciturn to observers, but as one teacher noted, "was very capable of playing tricks on others," adding that "He is totally dedicated to his family and filled with a sense of patriotism." Perhaps even more glowing and meaningful was the assertion that Hazen "was the best boss I ever had."

Another close associate and friend pointed out that Hazen was not a man to make snap decisions, frequently suggesting "let's sleep on it" until all the facts in a situation were known. "He was quick to praise and slow to criticize and no matter what he did, he did well; and he did what was morally right.

We chose our Class colors of Royal Blue and Gray, Class Flower, the yellow rose and Class Motto, "We have climbed the hill-the mountain lies before us." A class party in the school gym and a party at Myers Lake were our Freshman activities.

Our Sophomore year began with 31 students. We sold school supplies, sponsored two dances including the Freshman initiation. We participated in school plays, literary, track, baseball, and basketball.

Our Junior began with 30. We sold candy and potato chips. Christmas cards and sponsor a scrap drive and held bake sales. Plus a Christmas dance, all in effort to raise money to sponsor the Junior-Senior prom. We were all dressed up on April 28, 1951 and headed to the Greentown Legion Hall with Judy Warstler's orchestra providing the music.

The Prom committee made it a great success. The summer went fast and in September 1951, twenty nine answered the roll call. The third week in September our class rings arrived and we enjoyed showing them to the underclassmen. Our activities included a magician show and the Senior Play, "Tattletale." The whole class participated in the production that was a big success.

The next big item of our Senior year happened after the Christmas break. We moved into the NEW HIGH SCHOOL. Wow!!! How big, clean and bright. That gave us the honor of being the first graduating class. We were the guests at the Prom this year, which was held at the St. Francis Hotel in Canton. Baccalaureate was on May 18th and graduation followed on May 21st.

Our class trip was to New York and seeing the Statute of Liberty, Radio City Music Hall, "Big" cafeterias and big buildings, left us "country kids" wide eyed and breathless!! **Thanks Marlboro Township for our education and preparing us for the future!**

This lifelong resident of Lexington Township was born the son of the late Oscar and Dorothy Hazen, the family which also included a brother, Paul.

Tom attended the two room Bolton School, his education continued at Alliance High School and with influence from Uncle Leslie he graduated from Mount Union College. He added a master's degree from Kent State University.

While he felt a strong desire to pursue medicine, the Depression and finances made this impossible and he entered the field of education

Jobs were scarce when he was hired at East Canton (an annual salary of \$1,080) where one of his students was eventual movie star Jean Peters. Charles Pfouts then hired Hazen at Marlboro High School as a teacher and coach where his team wound up playing for the county championship.

With the U.S.A immersed in World War II, Hazen received his draft notice in 1942 and went to Camp Edwards where he mentioned his desire to be in a medical unit.

His Division arrived in New York and 13 days later was in Africa. He was involved in the invasion of Salerno, Italy, where he was a litter bearer, then into France and the final European campaign. At one time his unit stood in review for General Eisenhower.

Cpl. Hazen was presented a full commission as second lieutenant in the medical corps. He was a
