At the end of the concert, as alumni and future alumni crowded the stage to sing The Hallelujah Chorus, the potential began to unfold.


Robert Rosia ('10)



2010's Outstanding Alumni: Gordon Knisely

Nominated by his former students, **Gerald** (**'56) and Mary** (**'58)** (**Anstine**) **Bixler**, Gordon Knisely was named the 2010 MAA Outstanding Alumni.

Mr. Knisely served in the U.S. Army from 1946 to 1947. After finishing his duty, he was drafted by the Chicago Cubs Baseball Club in 1947 and named All-Star Catcher while playing in the minor leagues in 1948. A resident of Marlboro, he simultaneously played for and coached the Marlboro High School basketball team his senior year of high school. He attended Kent State University, majoring in health and physical education, with a science minor. In 1951 he earned his Bachelor of Science Degree and his Masters Degree in 1962. Mr. Knisely taught at Marlboro High School from 1951 to 1956, teaching 7th, 8th, and 9th grade science, as well as 10th grade World History and Physical Education. He also coached football, basketball, baseball and track.

He taught in the North Canton schools from 1956-1984. He was the Jennings Scholar Winner of 1975-1976 as well as North Canton Teacher of the Year and nominated for Ohio Teacher of the Year. He developed the Earth Science program for North Canton Schools and was President of the North Canton Education Association. He coached football, basketball and baseball for the district and was named Stark County Baseball Coach of

the Year in both 1974 and 1980. In 1990, Mr. Knisely was inducted into the Stark County Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame and the Hall of Distinction for North Canton City Schools. Mr. Knisely taught school for 33 years, never missing a day!

Nominators Gerald ('56) and Mary Anstine ('58) Bixler said Mr. Knisely "was an excellent teacher, coach, friend, and mentor. Gordon has truly influenced the lives of many people in a positive way. He taught Jeff Logan, who played for Ohio State; Dick Snyder, who played for the Cleveland Cavaliers; and Todd Blackledge, who played pro football and is now an announcer for ESPN football." Mr. Knisley met his late wife, Eileen, in Illinois while playing minor league baseball. They have two daughters, both of whom are teachers. He occasionally works at Fairway Golf Course, enjoys playing golf and in his free time assists in his daughters' classrooms.
